Using the Tables

This product has three master tables that each contain 50 animals that are common to either the tundra, arctic or Antarctic region. To use these tables, just choose the table appropriate to the environment and roll a d100 intermittently while exploring. Alternately, for the arctic and tundra regions, you can roll a d20 and consult one of the specific tables below to create a more controlled encounter; for the Antarctic region, a specific table for one of its most unique residents - the penguin has been provided. The Sea Animals Table can also be used for either arctic or Antarctic seas.

In worlds where there is no split between the arctic or Antarctic region the tables can be combined by first rolling a d100. If the result is 1-50, use the arctic table, if 51-100, use the Antarctic.

For a more organized use of these tables roll once for every 2 hours of in-game travel through a tundra or once for every 3 hours in an arctic or Antarctic region.

Tundra Verses Arctic Regions

The tundra is a cold region usually containing a thick layer of permafrost, with hardy tress, scrubs and grasses. They can be located on the fringes of arctic or Antarctic regions as a transition zone, but they are also found in high altitudes or mountainous regions. Arctic and Antarctic zones, on the other hand, are frozen lands that receive snow for most of the year and contain large sheets of ice at their edges.
